Bart P. Billings, PhD, a retired U.S. Army Colonel, is a licensed clinical psychologist and marriage and family therapist. He has been chief of professional services and assistant director at the University Of California Davis Medical School's Physical Medicine and Rehabilitation Department. He has also been senior faculty at the William Glasser MD Institute for thirty-five years and has taught classes at universities including the University of San Francisco, University of California Davis and United States International University. During Dr. Billing's service as commanding officer for a general hospital section in the U.S. Army Reserves, he founded and directed the National Tri-Service Prisoner of War Conference and the military-wide Human Assistance Rapid Response Team (HARRT) program. Dr. Billings also directs the oldest annual military stress conference, the International Military and Civilian Combat Stress Conference. Dr. Billings has been interviewed on ABC News Nightline and ABC World News with Charlie Gibson about combat stress. Dr. Billings was invited to give testimony at Congressional and State Legislative hearings on the need for better Mental Health Treatment Programs for military personnel and their families. These hearings resulted in the awarding of a multi-million dollar Department Of Defense grant for national research on how to improve treatment for Post-Traumatic Stress Disorder and Traumatic Brain Injuries.
