The flu is a major contributor to lost productivity and higher costs

According to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC), on average 5% to 20% of the U.S. population gets the flu every year. For an active, unpredictable flu season, that could mean that more than 62 million Americans might be infected.¹

And, according to a 2011 Walgreens study, the 2010 flu season resulted in 100 million lost workdays. For a small employer, that could mean as much as five missed workdays each year for every employee who experiences flu-like symptoms.

Unfortunately, 80% of those who experienced the flu still went to work; possibly exposing their co-workers to infection.²

In addition, parents who bring home the flu risk spreading the illness to the rest of the family. In a typical flu season, as many as 32 million missed school days were reported from the flu, which can also impact parent work schedules. Of parents who had a child home sick with the flu, 40% had to take additional time off work, while more than one-third had to make alternate arrangements.²

Taking into account missed workdays, vacations, child-care costs, doctors' visits and other related costs, nearly one-third of survey respondents in the Walgreens study spent between \$251 and \$1000 treating the flu.²

- About half of all adults, ages 18 to 64, don't see a physician regularly. These people will not be advised about which immunizations they need, and may not know the consequences of going unvaccinated.
- Furthermore, 78% of adults, ages 18 to 64, when asked, didn't know which vaccines were recommended for them, although 71% said they would like to know.
- · One-third of all adults who plan to get a flu shot each year don't do so, because they just can't seem to find the time.

Frequently asked questions
